You can get benefits for longer than 45 months if you are:

- Receiving treatment or services for domestic violence or substance abuse
- Diagnosed and receiving treatment for mental health needs
- Cooperating with the Children's Division open treatment plan and participating in MWA
- Have a temporary family crisis such as a home fire, crime victim, company layoff or serious injury

If approved for Temporary Assistance, you must:

- Tell the Family Support Division of changes to your household
- Participate with the Missouri Work Assistance
 Program (if required) or benefits will end

Temporary Assistance

What is it?

A program that gives cash benefits to lowincome persons to help pay for basic needs



Who is eligible?

Parents | Caretakers | Legal Guardians

- Have a child under 18, or under 19 if child is in high school
- Are citizens or eligible immigrants
- Are residents of Missouri
- Have income and resources under \$1,000
- Have no felony drug conviction after 8/22/96*
- *Children in home may still be eligible

To qualify you must:

- Everyone must complete an orientation
- Complete a Personal Responsibility Plan (if required)
- Comply with drug testing (if required)
- Cooperate with Child Support (if required)
- Register or log into their jobs.mo.gov account (if required)



Benefits:

- Free to Temporary Assistance recipients
- Provides you transportation help
- Helps you prepare for and find a job
- Gives you access to childcare
- Helps you with clothes, tools and other expenses for training and jobs
- Gives you help in making future plans

MWA encourages all Temporary Assistance Recipients to participate. The lifetime limit of benefits is **45 months**.

You may not have to participate if you are:

- Disabled or caring for a disabled household member
- Have a child under 12 weeks
- 60 or older
- A victim of domestic violence or natural disaster FSD may ask for more information.
