NOTIFICATION OF CHANGE – Parents Ineligible for MAF/TMA

House Bill 1011 (2004) reduced the income limits for parents/caretakers to receive healthcare coverage under the Medical Assistance for Families (MAF) program from 77% to 75% of the federal poverty level (13CSR 40-2.375). Income information on file for your family indicates your income is above 75% of the federal poverty level. Effective July 1, 2004, the parents/caretakers (age 19 and over) in your home will no longer be eligible for MC+ healthcare coverage. There is no change in your children's MC+ healthcare coverage.

Our files also indicate that the parents/caretakers in your home do not meet the requirements necessary to qualify for Transitional Medical Assistance. The TMA program provides MC+ healthcare coverage for up to twelve months to families with countable earned income who have received healthcare coverage under the MAF program for at least three of the last six months prior to July 1, 2004. If you feel you do qualify for TMA, please contact your local Family Support Office immediately.

Eligibility may exist for MC+ healthcare or other medical assistance programs if any of the following apply to the parents/caretakers:

- An individual has a physical or mental disability which is expected to last for at least twelve (12) months;
- An individual is pregnant;
- An individual is blind; or
- A change in circumstances has occurred, such as a change in income.
