Public Notice Regarding the Targeted Case Management for Developmentally Disabled Individuals Program Administered by the Department of Mental Health

Pursuant to Sections 1902(a)13(A) of the Social Security Act and 42 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 447.205, which mandate that proposed changes in statewide methods and standards for setting Medicaid payment rates be published and made available for review and comment, this is to advise that:

1. The Missouri Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division, along with the Missouri Department of Mental Health provides notice of the following:

To ensure efficiency, economy, quality of care, and access, a State Plan Amendment for Targeted Case Management for Developmentally Disabled Individuals (DD TCM) is being submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. This State Plan Amendment is contingent upon the approval by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. This State Plan will be submitted under State Plan Transmittal Number 23-0004 and has an effective date of January 1, 2023.

This State Plan Amendment adds completion of the Health Risk Screening Tool as a case management activity and allows for a Value Based Payment for DD TCM providers.

Total annual fiscal impact is estimated as \$660,000 (\$226,000 state share and \$434,000 federal share) as a result of this change.
