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



**Figure 1. Regions**




## Figure 2. Reason for Child Care

July 2011




12-Month Average  
July 2010-June 2011




## Figure 3. Children Served by Facility

July 2011




12-Month Average  
July 2010-June 2011




## Figure 4. Children Served by Provider





**Figure 5. Children Served**




**Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments**




### Figure 7. Children Served by Region







**Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 by Facility**






**Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 by Facility**






**Figure 11. Children Served Age > 5 by Facility**






**Figure 12. Children Served in Center by Age**






**Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home by Age**






**Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home by Age**





**July 2011**




**12-Month Average  
July 2010-June 2011**




**Figure 16. Child Care Providers by Type**
