




**Figure 2. Reason for Child Care**

**November 2013**




**12-Month Average  
December 2012-November 2013**




**Figure 3. Children Served by Facility**




**12-Month Average  
December 2012-November 2013**




**Figure 4. Children Served by Provider**



**Figure 5. Children Served**




**Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments**




## Figure 7. Children Served by Region










**Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 by Facility**






**Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 by Facility**






**Figure 11. Children Served Age > 5 by Facility**






**Figure 12. Children Served in Center by Age**






**Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home by Age**






**Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home by Age**





NOVEMBER 2013**




**Figure 16. TRANSITIONAL CHILDREN BY REGION  
NOVEMBER 2013**










**Figure 18. Child Care Providers by Type**




**Figure 19. Expenditures by Reason for Care**


**Figure 20. Households by Reason for Care**
