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




**Figure 1. Regions**




**Figure 2. Reason for Child Care**



**Figure 5. Children Served During April 2015**




**Figure 6. Block Grant Child Care Payments**




# Figure 7. Children Served By Region










**Figure 9. Children Served Age < 2 By Facility**





**Figure 10. Children Served Ages 2-5 By Facility**




**Figure 11. Children Served Ages > 5 By Facility**




**Figure 12. Children Served in Center By Age**






**Figure 13. Children Served in Family Home By Age**






**Figure 14. Children Served in Group Home By Age**





APRIL 2015**





APRIL 2015**




**Figure 18. TRANSITIONAL CHILDREN LEVEL 2 BY REGION  
APRIL 2015**










**Figure 20. Child Care Providers By Type**



**Figure 21. Expenditures by Reason for Care**




**Figure 22. Households by Reason for Care**
